NOTICE OF VEGETATION PROGRAM

Municipal spray contract commences

May 15- October 31, 2024

Municipal contracted sprayers will be conducting herbicide applications on regulated noxious and prohibited noxious weeds on Municipal properties.

Due diligence regarding public safety and environmental health will be followed. The risk is minimal though it is recommended to stay off treated sites for 24 hours following the application time which can be found on posted signage at the site.

Municipal weed inspectors will be conducing inspections on private properties, industrial sites, and acreages.

Biennial

Key ID Features

- Small purple flowers that grow on burs
 - 100-300 cm tall
- Clustered burs with inward hooked tips
- Rough and sparsely hairy stems
- Large triangular to broadly ovate leaves
- Mound of leaves and slender taproot in first year of growth
- Hooked barbs attach easily to clothing and hair

Treatment Options

- Rosettes can be hand pulled
- Mature plants can be cut or dug up prior to flowering
